Notification: - Modified Regulation for 3 Year LLB and 5 year LLB Programmes.

As per the recommendation of the CCS, Law, Gauhati University and subsequent approval by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Gauhati University (subject to the approval by the Academic Council, Gauhati University), the following are notified in connection with 3- and 5- year LLB programmes for information
